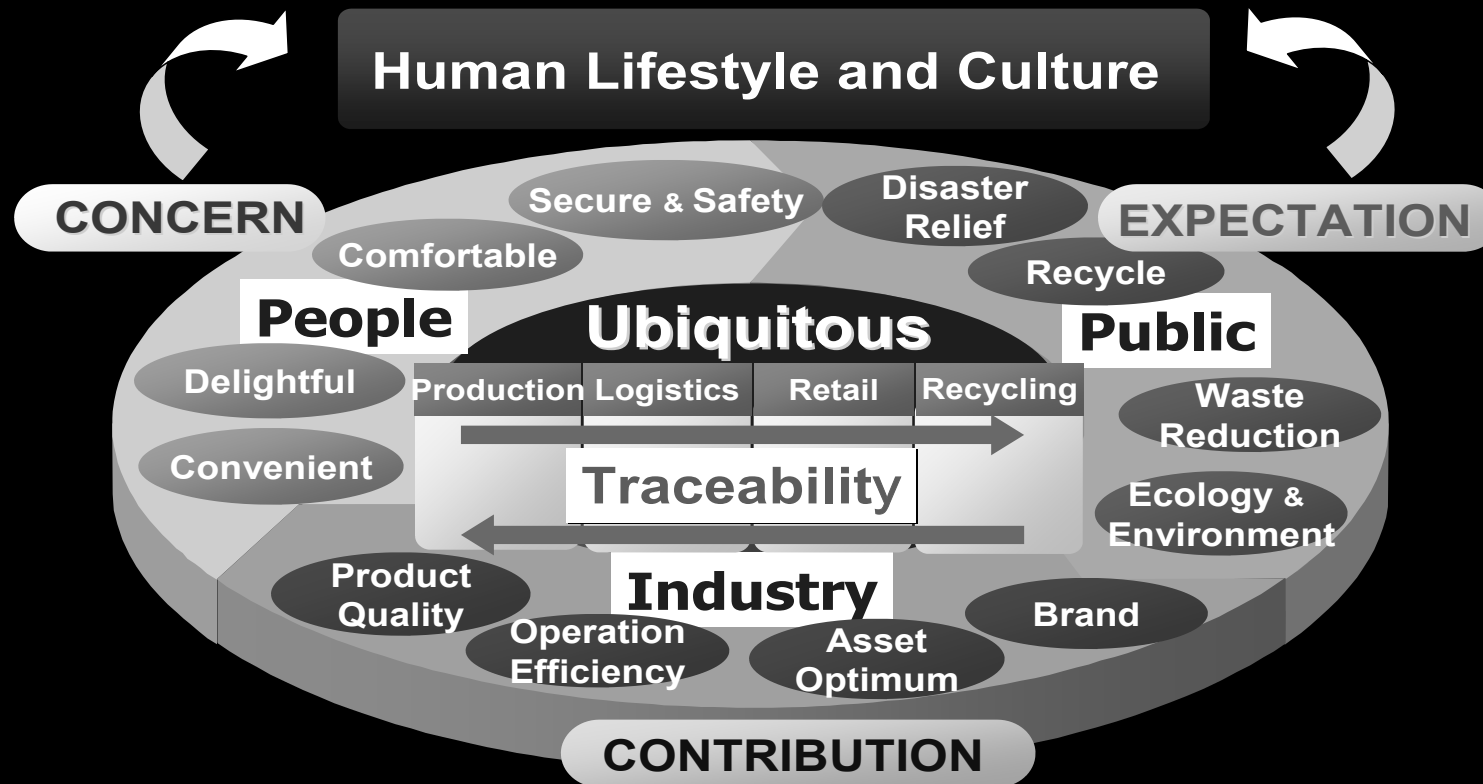

- Research on more sophisticated RFID:
FP7 - ICT call 1 projects have started to touch ground (IPs, STREP, CSA)
- Research on IoT and next generation EI:
FP7 - ICT call 5 in 2009
- CIP PSP:
2008 - RFID Thematic Network
2009 - Pilot on RFID
