Observations

- Almost all middleware projects represented are involved to some extent with OGF specifications/standards
 - EU could have a very significant say on the emerging standards
 - Very little standards activity outside OGF
- We should caution against "standards euphoria"
 - Standards should come AFTER use, not before.
- Projects with user communities invariably involve the use of domain specific standards
 - Most notably in the form of Data. Linking with the Data Track would probably highlight this further
 - We should expect a significant increase in this as involvement with user communities increases (<15% of attendees are non-IT or non-physics users)
 - User communities are sceptical of the value in providing input to the standards activities
- Other EU units are doing a similar standards audit. We should consider cross unit collaboration
 - (Also done in the NextGrid project)

Issues arising in compiling results

- Project Involvement in standards is variable
 - Significant role (Chair, Co-Chair, secretary etc) in driving the standardisation/specification process
 - Participant in the definition of the specification
 - Implementing the specification
 - Using the specification
 - Considering/thinking that a specification/standard may be needed
- Specifications/Standards go down the stack a long way where do you stop?
 - UNICORE 6, Globus 4 and GRIA implement WSRF, but should a project developing applications claim they are WSRF users?
- Suggestion
 - Projects need to state their level of participation/expected participation in the standards
 - Projects should only claim use of a standard if they have to interface directly to the standard
