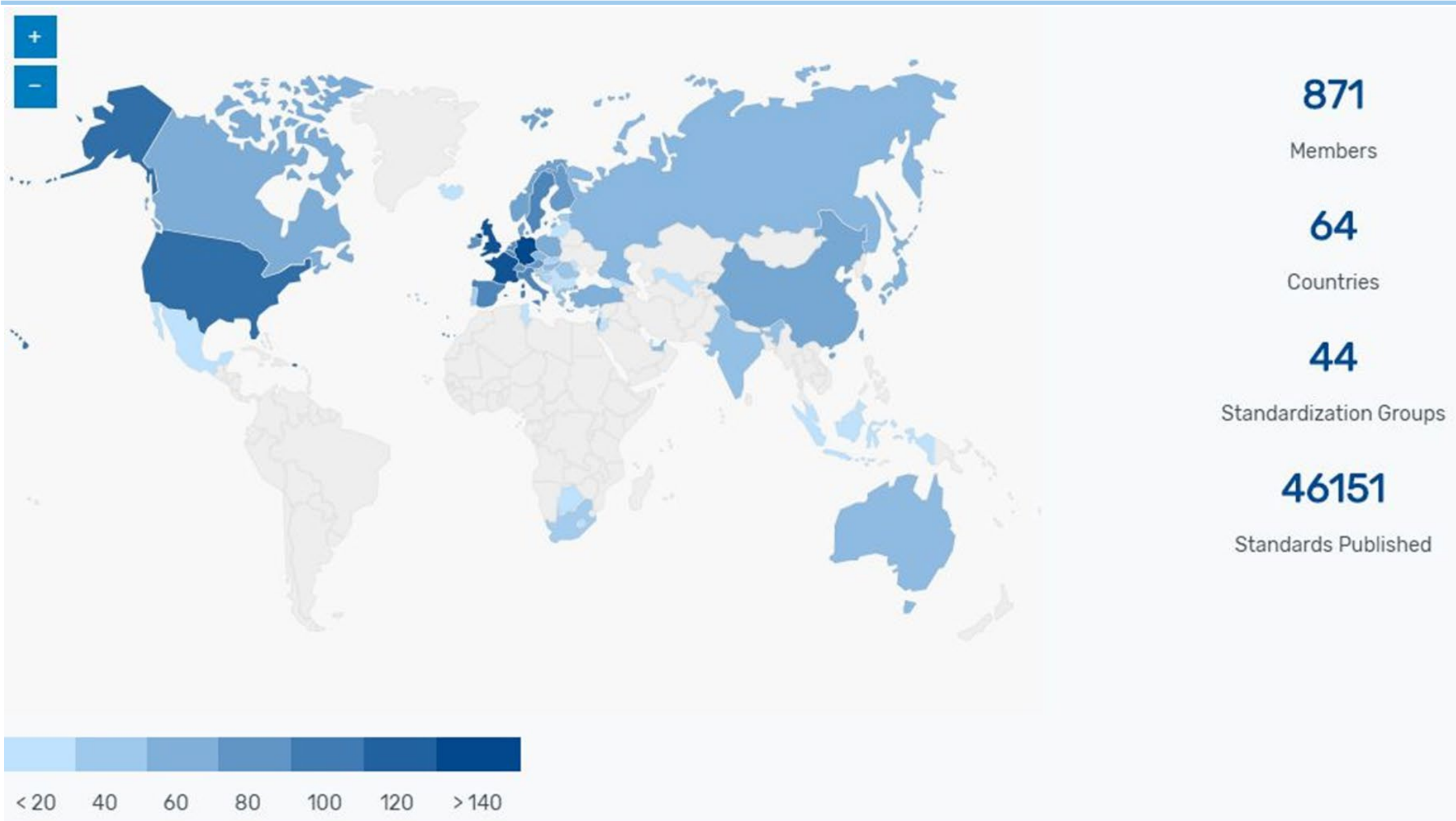

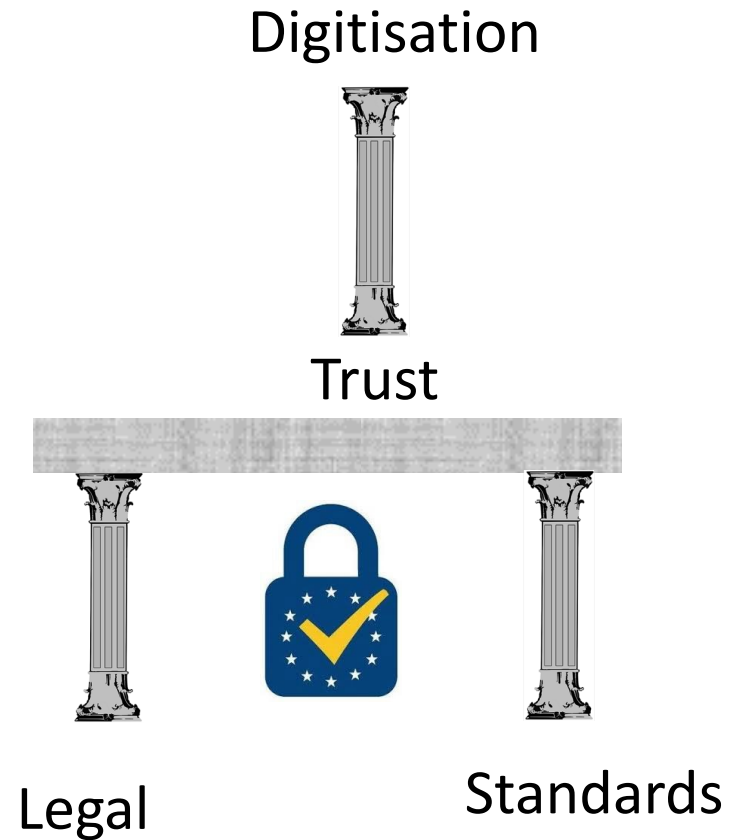

# eIDAS Trust Service aims: Trust supported by Legislation and Standards





# Trust Services

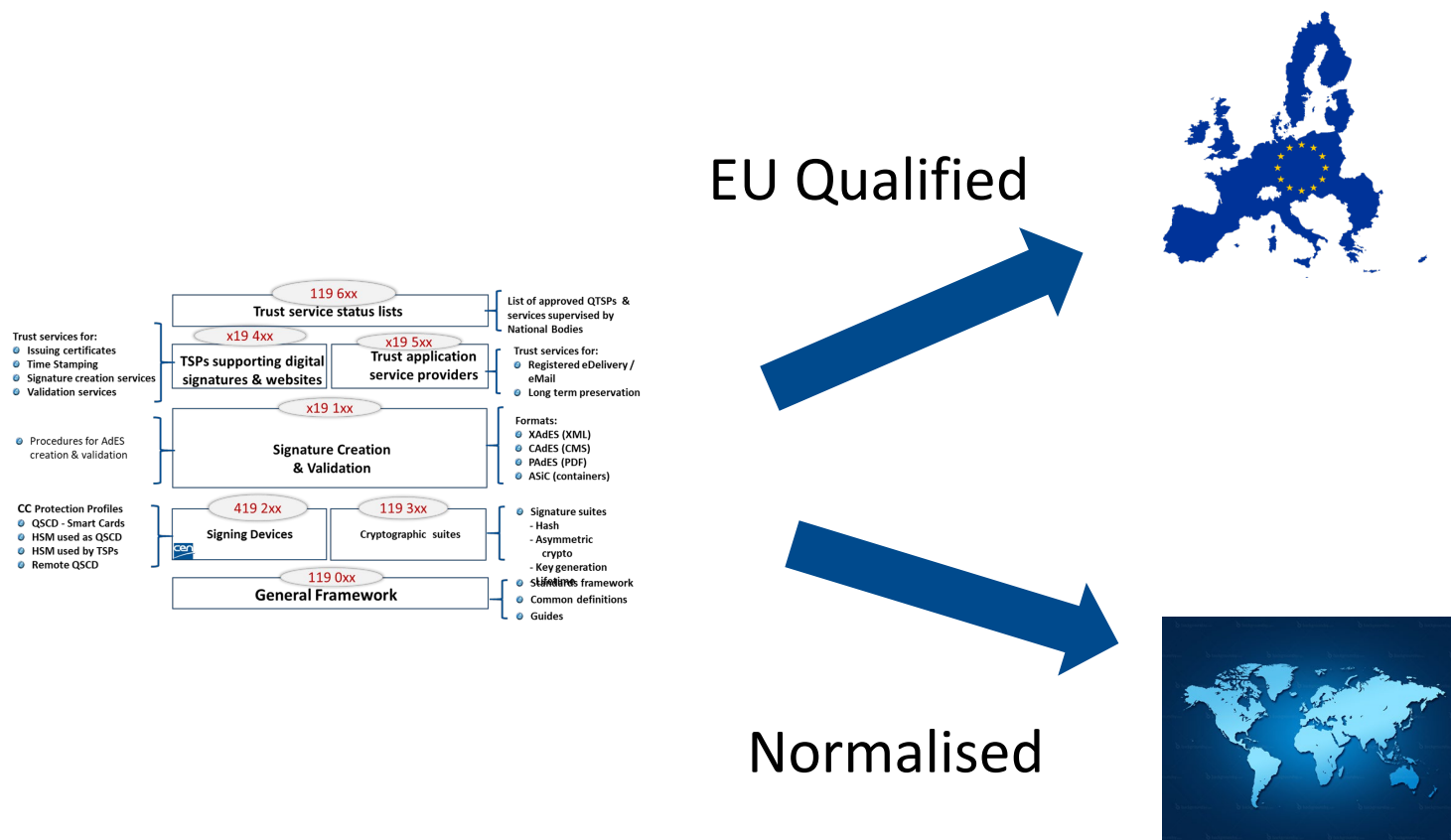
---

- Electronic signature: personal identity linked to data via certificate
- Electronic seal: organisation identity linked to data via certificate
- Website authentication: identity linked to website via certificate
- Registered e-delivery / e-mail: trusted service provider proof delivery etc.
- Time-stamping: Trusted time linked to data via time-stamp

Not recognised as trusted service in EU but applied by similar services across the world

- Electronic Identity: personal / organisation identity linked to service access via certificate

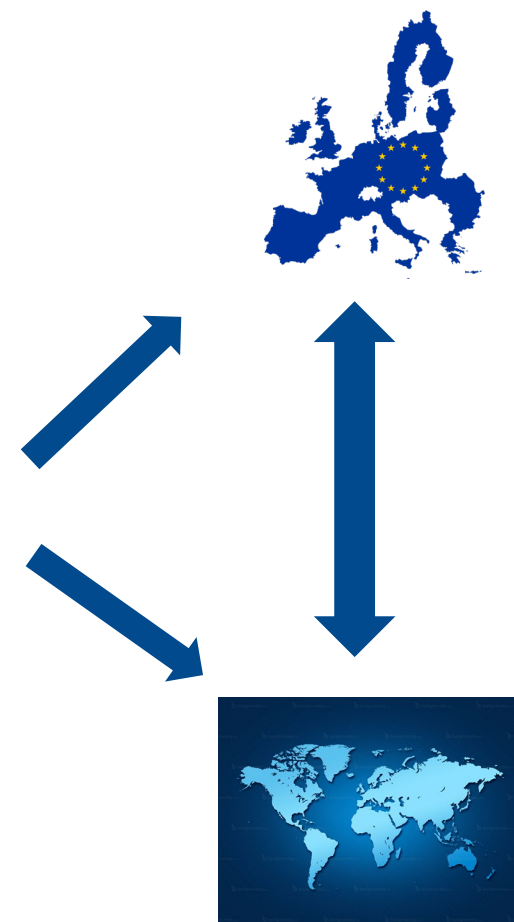
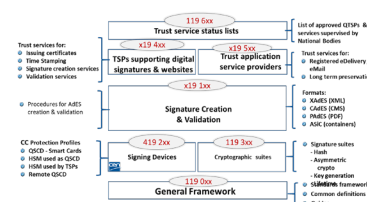




# ETSI Study on Globalisation of Trust Services

## Aim

- To facilitate cross recognition between EU trust services, based on ETSI standards supporting the eIDAS Regulation (EU) No 910/2014, and trust services from other schemes

## Legal context

- Regulatory or agreement
- Community: national, regional, global, sector

- Legal basis: Reference to law / agreement
- Specific requirements: Regulatory documents

## Supervision & Audit

- Supervisory / approval body
- Audit process and auditor requirements

## Best practices

- IETF PKIX, ETSI, ISO 21188, CAB Forum

## Trust representation

- Trust list, root store, bridge certificate

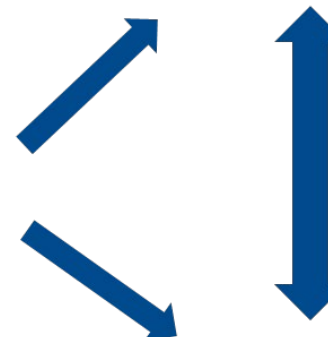
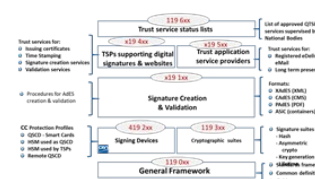
